Meeting Minutes</b> Dr. Ebell introduced Ms. Sara Holder, SBAC Chair, to review the minutes from the December 12, 2018 meeting. The minutes were approved by consensus and are posted on the District website.</p> <p><b>4. SBAC Comments and Questions</b> Ms. Sara Holder presented the following community questions, community input and draft responses to the committee:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>"One of many buying a home in Coastal Point for the reason that it is zoned to Mossman Elementary. Currently live in South Shore Harbour and my son already attends Mossman. Geographically it's much closer to Mossman, as section 1 will be sharing a fence with Marbella and Madrid Lane will be the main point of entry for Coastal Point for a few years. Madrid Lane is in walking distance of the Village. My concern now is building in Coastal and being zoned to Stewart which is further away."</i></li> </ul> <p><b>Response:</b> Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.</p>

- *"Please keep Coastal Point zoned to Mossman Elementary. I'm a homeowner in Mar Bella and realtor of 18 years building new home in Coastal Point. I do not have children in Mossman anymore, but have clients and others building in Coastal based on the sole premise of it being zoned to Coastal. A lot of these people have children currently enrolled at Mossman. It just makes sense geographically since it is one street behind Mar Bella and Madrid is the main entrance to Coastal for the next few years. It is within walking distance. It makes more sense to take all of South Shore out of Mossman than it does Coastal Point. Please consider because of the geographic location to Mossman. People building new homes in CP will back out if it changes to Stewart, I have spoken with quite a few buyers under contract. Thank you."*

- *"Concerned about Seabrook Int zoned kids currently go to Clear Falls. How is the 146 construction going to affect their route to school? Lake is a better alternative in terms of transportation. (Live in El Lago)"*

- *"Would really prefer Space Center Intermediate and Clear Lake High School if possible."*

- *"Keep Nassau Bay community zoned for Clear Creek High School."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"Please don't rezone any current students who attend Clear Creek High School. This would be devastating to have to change schools at this point."*

- *"The kids from Nassau Bay should be zoned to go to Space Center Intermediate and then on to Clear Lake High. There is no reason to send the kids from Nassau Bay around the lake to go to intermediate or high school."*

- *"My concern is how kids that live less than 1/2 a mile from Mossman have to go to a school that takes 15-20 minutes to get to. Tax dollars busing these kids so far away because South shore village parents want their kids to go to the new school. And no, I don't have any kids or relatives that go to any CCISD schools. It just doesn't make since."*

- *"I like my Nassau Bay Robinson kids to go to Space Center Intermediate and then to Clear Lake High school. They should not be driving to League City and separated from their friends."*

- *"We would like Nassau Bay kids to stay at Creek."*

- *"As long as overall costs stay the same or go down, the boundaries should be drawn up as cost-effectively as possible."*

- *"I am concerned that University Green & University Place will be zoned out of Falcon Pass Elementary. I think these two neighborhoods are important to the Falcon Pass community, the kids have already built lives outside of the school, but still affiliated with the school through both Cub & Girl Scouts & sporting teams. A lot of the diversity at FPE comes from these two neighborhoods."*

- *"With regards to the possible changes for students attending Space Center Intermediate, our preference would be to have children from Nassau Bay attend Robinson Elementary, then Space Center Intermediate, followed by Clear Lake High School."*

- *"Nassau Bay-I have a fourth graders at St. Thomas Episcopal, I debate going to Space Center Intermediate vs. LSA because I don't want her to make friends in Intermediate then have to start over in 9th grade because all her friends are at Lake. My husband and I both attended CCISD all the way thru and don't feel it is fair to Nassau Bay kids not to go to Lake and have to make new friends especially at such a critical age."*

- *"We bought a home in Nassau Bay with the understanding that our children will go to Robinson and the Space Center. We believe this should be the case for our children. As teachers ourselves, we feel It is in the best academic and mental consideration to have Nassau Bay zoned for these 2 schools and then on to Clear lake as well."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"It is my understanding that the district is considering rezoning Nassau Bay so that they would attend different intermediate and high schools to what they are currently zoned for. This is a MAJOR concern for me. My kid's mother and I did extensive research on the schools in this area before start of school last year because our kids were beginning public for the first time after being in private school. My son currently attends Space Center and our daughter Robinson. After deciding what the best option was for our kids I purposely bought a house in Nassau Bay so that they could attend Robinson, space Center, and Lake. It would be a huge disappointment to us as parents as well as a set back to their education as we fill the other options are not a good fit. I ask that you please do not rezone Nassau Bay. Thank you."*

- *"Children living in Taylor Lake Village/Seabrook should be able to attend Clear Lake High School 5.8 miles away instead of Clear Falls High School 8 miles away and on the other side of the Kemah Bridge. Anyone who lives in the area knows that crossing the Kemah Bridge at high traffic times can take forever. So instead of a 20 minute round trip to Clear Lake High, we will have to spend an hour or more to go to Clear Falls and back. And Clear Lake High is consistently rated one of the top schools in the nation. I would like that benefits of that education for my son. These boundaries make no sense at all."*

- *"Concern: we live in clear lake forest - going to Seabrook intermediate for 6th or the science magnet, and clear falls for high school is going to be more difficult with construction on 146. I think clear lake and space center would be better alternatives than passing over 146 until construction is complete... school traffic adds to an already burdened road."*

- *"The two reasons I can think of for moving Robinson kids to Space center are avoiding 146 construction and to fill the void created by opening Falcon Pass Intermediate. None of this will really affect Nassau bay. I know the district is always. Looking at the diversity levels and keeping 20-30% low income. This move would probably bring this level back after you pulled north clear lake out of Space center. You would also need to rebalance Seabrook and Bayside. The fantasy of Nassau Bay ever going to Lake is just the same old talk. Just keep improving Creek like you promised years ago and think no body members. New pool, new orchestra room."*

- *"Would the district's plan effect the boundaries for the WAVE schools? My child will be an 8th grader at LCIS WAVE next year and I would want her to complete intermediate school there to maintain stability and the extracurricular programs that she has been in for the last two years at that school."*

No final recommendations have been developed by the SBAC, but it is unlikely that intermediate attendance zone modifications would impact magnets. - *"Nassau Bay Kids: Robinson Elementary > (Intermediate that keeps most kids together or that the majority of NB wants) > Clear LAKE High School"*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"We live in Nassau Bay. I would like for my 2 children to continue to go to Robinson and I would also like them to continue with their classmates from Robinson to Space Center Intermediate and on to Clear Lake High. That would be outstanding. It also makes more sense logistically."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"Our daughter is currently enrolled in the 4th grade at Robinson Elementary. We are homeowners in Nassau Bay and have lived here since she was two. We have always known that our particular neighborhood gets the 'short end of the stick' when it comes to changing schools at the intermediate and high school levels. Both of the times our daughter will graduate to another public school level, she will essentially be starting over with all new children and will have to make all new friends. It truly is as if our neighborhood children are the 'new kids' after a move. So many strong friendships are forged during the elementary and the intermediate school age levels. Unfortunately, our neighborhood does not get to continue on with the benefit of these friendships through our children's school careers. As I mentioned, we knew this when we chose our neighborhood, but we didn't and don't agree with it. Our little city has a very strong sense of community. That is why we chose Nassau Bay. Unfortunately, that came along with our current school assignments. We hope that you can consider keeping ALL of the Robinson children together, along with those from Nassau Bay, throughout both Intermediate and high school levels. Many of the parents of our daughter's Robinson Elementary friends were unaware that their children would not have our daughter in school with them past elementary. My daughter has never wanted to say goodbye to her best friends. She won't want to do it again in intermediate school either. Please consider this as an option. Can the committee consider sending all of Robinson Elementary, including Nassau Bay, to Space Center Intermediate and then on to Clear Lake High School? This would keep all of the children currently at Robinson elementary school together, as they should be. I believe this scenario to be the best fit for all of the children's emotional growth and for their learning environment."*

- *"Clear lake forest neighborhood and Robinson elementary kids shouldn't be split to go to creek. Lake is much closer and a less dangerous drive for our students. If Kirby is used as the natural barrier it will split students from Robinson who have grown up playing together."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"Lack of balanced enrollment in high schools. Lake has no pure intermediate feeder school. Hyde Elementary zoned to Creek which is closer than Falls. I prefer "hard" definite boundaries like Freeways. Creeks, etc. i.e., those high schoolers north of the Creek should be zoned to Brook, not Springs, those west of Taylor Lake to Lake HS. All those in the corridor between 145 and Hwy. 3 should be zoned to Creek."*

- *"We will have a daughter who will be a junior next year and one that will be a sophomore. Both currently attend Clear Falls. They are both involved in clubs and sports at Clear Falls. I understand under this new restructuring, my junior will be grandfathered into Falls but what about my Sophomore...we do not want them going to different schools. Please let us know what we need to do in order to keep them at the same school, which is Clear Falls! We have already moved them to a new state and they finally feel like they are fitting in where they are now. I can't imagine having to move them again. I think this would cause them quite a hardship."*

- *"I have 2 sophomores at Clear Falls 2018-2019 school year. We live in Seabrook. Will they be zoned to Falls 2019-2021?"*

**Response:** Thank you for your question. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee (SBAC). The SBAC has not yet developed final recommendations school attendance zone recommendations. Once those recommendation are completed, information will be posted to the CCISD website for public review. Public hearings to gather feedback are scheduled January 15-29, 2019. Please check the CCISD website for specific dates and locations. The CCISD Board of Trustees makes the final decision about attendance zones and policy related matters such as 'grandfathering' students into schools after rezoning. Thank you again.

- *"For Nassau Bay residents, it is suggested:(Elementary) Robinson, (Intermediate) Space Center, (High School) Clear Lake"*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"I want my kids to go to clear lake high school. Almost everyone that goes to space center int is zoned to Lake, therefore all of my kids' friends would end up going to different high school (lake), and my kids going to Creek. Plus my kids already prefer lake over Creek. My daughter would be really upset if she would end up going to Creek instead of being with all of her friends and in a school she actually wants to be in."*

- *"Please do not change the boundaries. My 2 oldest kids have already started going to Clear Falls and I want all 4 of them to finish there. I do not want my children going to different schools."*

- *"Hi! I saw in the last minutes that you moved the boundary for the Lake/Falls split to East and West of the lake. Is there a reason that the split isn't North and South of the Kemah bridge (with, of course, North of the bridge going to Lake and South of the bridge going to Falls). Without having access to any demographics, that would seem to make the most sense, and I personally like the idea of keeping all of 77586 together. Is this something you can look at? Thank you for your time!"*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"Mud lake should be the dividing line and not Kirby. I want my kids to continue through school with the friendships they have made in elementary school."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"Good afternoon. I am a Nassau Bay resident and for years the students residing here have been the so-called "red-headed stepchildren" of school zoning. My kids are zoned to Robinson Elementary (feeds to Seabrook Int.), then have to leave their friends to attend Space Center where they have to leave the majority of their friends again to attend Clear Creek HS while everyone else goes to Lake. I have read the proposed solutions and I applaud the committee's efforts to make transitions from elementary to intermediate and on to high school less disruptive. I do not mind which schools we are zoned to as long as the students get to stay with their classmates. I like the idea of Space Center and then Clear Lake OR Clear Creek Intermediate and then Clear Creek HS. I do have 2 kids in Clear Creek High School currently and have concerns that they would have to change schools if NB is rezoned to Clear Lake HS. Would that be the case?"*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee. By CCISD School Board Policy, students who have attended a high school for two years may be granted a transfer to continue at that high school.

- *"As a community member and parent of a child that attends Robinson Elementary, I believe very strongly that the children of Taylor lake village and the small off shoots of Pasadena all stay together. We live in a small neighborhood and have a strong community within Taylor lake Village. The lake should be the natural border, not a road that connects a community together! Wherever they are zoned, Robinson should go together."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"I live in Nassau Bay. I'd like to submit my preferences for the new school boundaries. I'd like Space Center Intermediate and Clear Lake High school. Both choices are best for me with regards to location. I'd also prefer Clear Lake High school because I've been told that it's a better school. Thank you for your consideration."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"Hello, I am a CCISD parent, living in Nassau bay and have the understanding that your committee is meeting this week to discuss zoning options for our neighborhood. I would prefer for our children to stay at Space Center Intermediate, then move on to Clear Lake High school for a couple of reasons. After reviewing the state rankings and school data, the above mentioned schools show higher performance in most areas. Secondly, and just as important, my children will be able to maintain their community and social stability by attending the same schools as their friends currently attending Robinson Elementary. I appreciate your consideration of my opinion and thank you for your time in this matter."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"Nassau Bay is my place of residency. Our students attend Robinson Elementary, Space Center Intermediate, and Clear Creek High School. I want our students to stay within the boundaries of these schools as the 2018-19 School Boundary Advisory Committee reviews numbers and potential changes to intermediate and high school boundaries. Thank you for serving on this committee."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"As a Nassau Bay parent of 2 students at Robinson Elementary, I would like to say that I am okay with the current zoning for Nassau Bay (Space Center Intermediate, Clear Creek High). I would rather not have the Nassau Bay students go to Clear Creek Intermediate from a logistics standpoint. Space Center Intermediate is much closer and is easier to transport our students to/from when they have extracurricular activities."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"We would like to see Nassau Bay zoned to Space Center Intermediate and Clear Lake High School. Thank you for your consideration."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"Suggestions for committee. Careful attention must be given to balancing out the high schools populations. Some neighborhoods who have always been together will, I believe, need to split to make reasonable boundaries. IE-Weber As you always do - give time to consider potential growth over the next several years. Know that you will receive ""flack"" no matter what you decide to do. Deal with it - do not make concessions based on the amount of agreement or disagreement."*

**Response:** Thank you for your input. Your comment has been shared with the School Boundary Advisory Committee.

- *"Hello. The following note is on the bottom of each of the SBAC meeting minutes. All materials discussed at the SBAC meeting will be on the CCISD website for review at: <http://www.ccisd.net/cms/One.aspx?portalId=645487&pageId=49119887> However, when the link is clicked it directs you back to the page with the agendas and the minutes. Where are the "discussed materials"? While I was not chosen to be an SBAC member I would appreciate being able to review the materials as suggested in the minutes. Thank you for your time."*

**Response:** Thank you for your comment. All materials discussed relate to attendance zone maps. Because these maps are all in draft form and can change from meeting to meeting, these are not posted to the website. Instead the meeting minutes are very detailed indicating areas that are discussed. The School Boundary Advisory Committee recommendations will be posted, along with maps, once these are presented to the CCISD Board of Trustees on January 7, 2019.

- *"Intermediate/High School -- Is there any possibility when looking at rezoning to send all students from intermediate schools to the same high school? Clear Lake Intermediate splits and sends some students to Brook and some to Lake. It would be nice if all elementary students attended the same intermediate school -- and all intermediate students attended the same high school. Please consider the possibility of keeping students together. Is there a place that the public can view the different Table and charts the SBAC has used that are referenced in*

*the meeting minutes? The bottom of the minutes states that everything is available on the website but the Table do not appear to be there. Thank you!"*

**Response:** Thank you for your comments and questions. Ideally, there would be direct feeder patterns from elementary to intermediate to high school. The reality of the areas in which families reside make this ideal very challenging, but committee members have worked to address these issues where possible. The meeting minutes are very detailed to provide the public information on committee discussions, but draft maps are not posted as these change frequently. Once the School Boundary Advisory Committee presents their recommendations to the CCISD Board of Trustees, draft attendance zone maps will also be posted and public hearings scheduled to gather public feedback.

- *"I have a current sophomore at Falls and a current 7th grader at Seabrook. Both of my children came from Robinson. Moving any child who came from Robinson to Space Center will disrupt their sports, music and extra curricular activities. It will also leave only two elementary schools feeding into Seabrook. It will also mean that in one more year, I will have two kids in two different high schools. As a single mother, this makes it impossible to get them to events, practices, games and school meetings. Can we find a way to feed Seabrook as it is today feed to the same high school?"*

## 5. Elementary and Secondary Map Review and Discussion

Dr. Ebell introduced Ms. Sara Holder to review the revised elementary map with the committee and share a proposed change to move an undeveloped area from Landolt Elementary to Greene Elementary. She also explained that the transportation department has reviewed the revised elementary map and does not have concerns. The committee then reviewed the revised elementary map individually and then with their table groups. The SBAC then reached consensus on the revised elementary map with the proposed change as presented by Ms. Holder.

Ms. Holder then reviewed the revised intermediate map with the committee and shared a proposed change to keep all of the Hidden Lakes subdivision zoned to Bayside Intermediate. The committee then reviewed the revised Intermediate map individually and with their table groups. The SBAC then discussed as a whole group, reaching consensus on the revised intermediate map with the following changes:

- Keep all Clear Lake City Elementary students together at Clear Lake Intermediate
- Keep the Nassau Bay community zoned to Space Center Intermediate
- Keep all of Hyde Elementary students together at Clear Creek Intermediate
- Keep all of the Hidden Lakes subdivision zoned to Bayside Intermediate

Ms. Holder then reviewed the revised high school map with the committee and shared two proposed changes to rezone the Coronado Townhomes to Clear Creek High School and to keep all the Hidden Lakes subdivision zoned to Clear Falls High School. The committee then reviewed the revised high school map individually and with their table groups. The SBAC then reached consensus on the revised high school map with the two proposed changes.
